Everyone has a pair of old, comfortable shoes, or an old, comfortable item of clothing; the type of item

that may look terrible, but when you need to be comforted or just want to truly relax, it is the item you put on. It may be old, battered, scuffed, ratty, tattered, and holey, but it has the ability to calm nerves, provide real rest, and embrace your being. Your family will not be seen in public with you while you are dressed that way, but you don't care.

For a lot of people, church is just like that. We want everything to fit comfortably. We want it to not rub, touch, or bind. We want it to be very familiar. However, just as we have more clothes than our old "comfies," we need more from our church, similar to what a cat seeks lying in a sunny window. We need our church to embrace us and secure us, but we also need to be challenged and encouraged to deepen our relationship with God by following the example of Jesus more and more.

Church is where we deepen existing relationships and build new relationships. We usually prefer to hang out with people our own ages or people with similar interests; yet the church is a family. All families have people of different ages. What mother wants to give birth to an adult (talk about labor). We learn and grow ourselves as we help guide and nurture the next generations. We are blessed from mentors who become friends and family. As we get older, we may not be able to keep up with children and teens, but we can learn from them, and we can be

inspired by them. Look at the example of sportsmanship demonstrated by the WRALL team after they won the World Championship in baseball. Rather than continuing their celebration, they ran over and embraced and literally lifted their competitors. This is how the church functions best. How many generations do we spend time with in church, not counting the generations who arrive in the same car?

Our faith is not something that we collect and keep. Some people have a hobby of collectibles. These items, for greatest value, are purchased and then are never removed from their packaging, or are stored where they can be protected from damage of any kind. Collectors of some toys never remove them from their boxes, but display them in a way that resembles an in-store display for purchase. These toys are never played with; they are never handled for fun. They are looked at and admired without physical contact.

Our faith is to be taken out and enjoyed. It is to be put to use. It may get banged up and bruised, but it will heal and become stronger for it. It may get challenged and laughed at, but again, it will grow stronger. Its value is not increased by admiration, nor by aging; rather its value is measured in how it is put to use day to day. It will not be the same as it was when you first became a Christian. It will be richer with more texture and color, more depth and dimension.

The point of all of this is that we must be open and creative in building opportunities to spend time together as a church family. We need to worship together, pray together, play together, and work together.

Not once or twice a year, but as often as is possible. As we dream, pray and share seeking our "Kingdom Potential", we need to move out of our comfortable clothes, take our faith off its shelf and exchange what we find comforting and faithful with others in our great church family.

SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

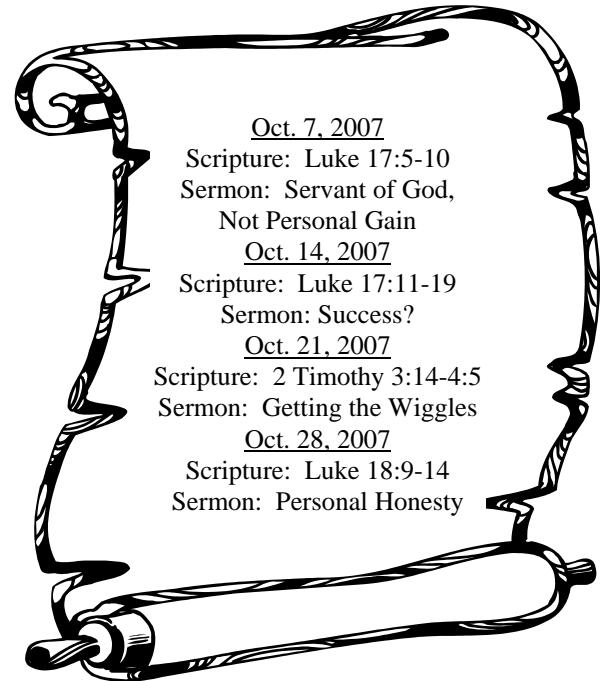
On September 16th, we had a special Sunday School kick-off in the fellowship hall with doughnuts and juice. Then we set off to our classrooms.
