One was suffering the recent loss of her husband, one was dealing with chronic illness, another was used to being able to bless & help another and due to a recent decline in health, she was unable to continue her project and was feeling saddened.

To date we have been able to bless over 125 people with prayer shawls. They are spread from coast to coast and throughout the state.

After church on Sunday, Sept. 27th, Ann and I traveled to Pooler, GA with several of our Corvette Club friends for a “Skill Building” day at Roebing Roads Race Track.
