We are now 50 years old as a congregation. In human terms this places us in mid-life, a time when

we look forward to the nearing retirement and a well earned rest. But the Church is not a human being! In reality, as a part of the body of Christ, we are in our childhood, maybe getting ready to start school, to learn new things, make new friends, and start to grow up.

During our celebration on June 10th, we will remember all who came before us and share in stories and pictures of our past. We will get reacquainted with old friends and introduce the newer members of the church to our heritage. But what about the next 50 years?

As we reach this milestone of 50 years, we must also begin to look at the future role this congregation will play in our community. We need to stop, pray, listen, commune, and fellowship with a desire to find God's challenge for the next decade and beyond.

As we enter the summer, be prepared to think about these things, to pray about them, and to get together to talk about them. There will be tools that are provided and tools that we have, but either have not used in a while or not used for this purpose. We will do these things for two reasons.

Reason One: God has called us to be a church in this community; a church of compassionate, thinking people who love God and one another. A church that strives to love and not judge, to embrace instead of push away. Are we doing this to the level God asks of us? Or is there more that we can do?

Reason Two: We are celebrating 50 years, and we need to chart our course for the next 50 years. If we do this, in 50 years, some of us will be invited to return and take part in the Centennial Celebration of First Christian Church in Warner Robins. I want it to be a celebration filled with the joy of

past ministries and the servants God has given us as traveling companions and to add to the heritage of the saints who established this church and its early vision.

Are you ready to ask God's guidance for the road ahead and to begin to set the course for the future? What a wonderful adventure it will be.




CWF GRACE GROUP
