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Once upon a time, there were the structures attached to the front of houses. Most often they

had a floor and a roof and this fence like enclosure around the outer edge that reached to about the waist of an average adult. Several stairs led up to an opening in the front of the fence like barrier and corresponded with the location of the house's front door. It was not uncommon to find chairs and even a swinging seat in this structure. It was called a front porch. People would sit outside on cool evenings and visit with passing neighbors or gather together on a neighboring porch and sit and talk.

Then prime time was created, followed by answering machines, cell phones and instant messaging. Front porches became smaller or disappeared completely. Face to face communication slipped away into the realm of the archaic.

A colleague shared a story about a youth mission trip. During the beginning of the trip the youth hardly spoke to one another because they were all busily text messaging one another with their cell phones. About a day away from their destination all the cell phones were collected and locked away, amid much complaining, for the duration of the trip to the mission. The phones would be returned on the way home. It took awhile, but soon the youth started talking to one another verbally. The week flew by and they left to come home. After about the second day on the road one of the youth

said, "Oh yeah, when do we get our phones back?" The phones were passed out and within hours, conversation surrendered to the beeping of text messages being composed.

Even this column is being written on a computer to be sent by e-mail so that it can be printed and sent by mail to other people. No face to face discussion. As a church, we need to live in community. Not a wired community only, but a face to face community. We need opportunities to gather together and share in worship and fellowship and mission. We need to gather with old friends and new friends. We need to gather with people our own ages and with people of a variety of ages. We need to gather to pray and to listen.

I grant that this kind of expectation demands the sacrifice of your time. You may not always have things occur as they would in your own home. You may have to risk welcoming strangers into your circle. This is what Jesus did.

As a church, as people of Christ, we are the body of Christ in this community and for each other. If, as we have claimed at the time of our baptism and sometimes reaffirmed when we change churches, we accept Jesus as Savior and agree to strive to walk closely along God's Way, this is among the changes we make to our life and lifestyle. Our commitment to God was not for one or two hours per week, but rather for our complete lives, our entire being, all that we are or will ever become.

When you have a family of faith, you have a resource of people to whom you may turn in

a time of challenge. A church family is supposed to be available for each other when we need prayer support. We are to help each other as best we can, even when we don't always agree on everything.


But we must be very diligent and intentional about it. We cannot sit back and wait for a We have to create opportunities to build the kind of trust and relationship that is needed. It can happen on Sunday morning before and after worship, if we talk to more than just the same small circles of friends. It can happen at carry-in dinners if we strive to sit with a variety of different people each month. It can happen in Sunday School as a class wrestles with the lesson and the questions it stimulates. It can occur in fellowship gatherings like CWF, Chi Rho and CYF, men's breakfasts, Tuesday morning breakfast and the Lunch Bunch. It can happen in new ways as well.

Is a deeper relationship with God and with our church family worth another couple of hours per week? Can you spare the time to help become a congregation led by the spirit of God in service and fellowship as well as worship? Does the hour in front of the TV or on the Internet answer your questions and meet the needs of your life? Then why not become a complete part of the presence of God in this place?




LUNCH BUNCH NEWS
