JUNE ELDERS & DEACONS

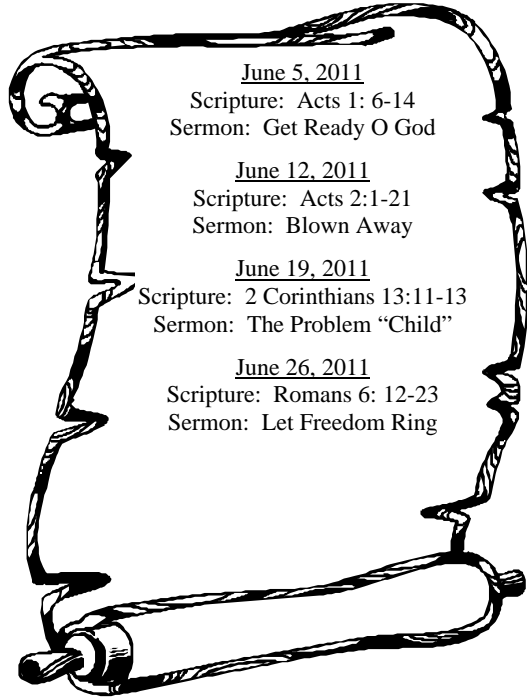
