We owe a large thanks to the work of the 2010 team for developing the plan for the renovation and overseeing the design and work. The facilities committee is having a couple of workdays to get the outside painting done and also to move things back into the kitchen. We look forward to seeing many of you there to help with this wonderful project.

I only hope that most of you have had the chance to visit the fellowship hall during the renovations to see first hand how nice it is beginning to look. Our new kitchen looks state of the art and when you stand in the kitchen I hope you will have the same feelings.

To me, the changes in our fellowship hall are amazing. The new doors, lights, and ceiling fans add a look of elegance to the room. We can all be proud of the work we have done to make this project a reality.



Do a good deed, or give something beneficial to a loved one.


Give of yourself. Offer your services to a hospital, to a church to help people. The law of giving will reward you tenfold.
