We have enjoyed it very much. She has also taken over the role of some of my physical therapy. Nothing too strenuous on her part. She just follows after me with my wheelchair when I walk using the walker in case I need to take a break.

I am also blessed in having met many really nice residents at The Summit Place. In particular, my two table mates for meals, Jane and Heyward, are-lovely people and offer many stimulating topics of conversation, as well as laughs. Jane's husband is a resident in the adjacent memory care unit. Heyward is a widower. Heyward is the ultimate Southern Gentleman. Jane is still active in the community and actually still drives.

I have begun to participate in some of the social activities at the home; but I still find that I need plenty of rest between meals and other scheduled activities. Sitting for long periods of time is still challenging. But that comes with having chronic back problems for more years than I care to remember. Other than that, I really haven't had any major medical issues.
